the Church of Scotland adopted the Confession of Faith in 1647 and the Catechisms in 1648 The Scottish Parliament ratified them in 1649 and again (after a time of political and religious strife) in 1690 The Presbyterian character of the Church of Scotland was safeguarded when Scotland and England were united under one crown in 1707
