D.I.R.E. Score: Patient Selection for Chronic Opioid Analgesia

DIRE Score: Patient Selection for Chronic Opioid Analgesia For each factor, rate the patient's score from 1-3 based on the explanations in the right

hand column Score Factor Explanation Diagnosis 1 = Benign chronic condition with minimal objective findings or no definite medical diagnosis
Examples: fibromyalgia, migraine headaches,

ALDRETE DISCHARGE SCORING: APPROPRIATE FOR POST 5 saturation (Appendix A) A score of 0-2 is given for each of the five categories, for a maximum score of 10 The Aldrete scoring system is the most widely used tool to clinically assess the physical status of patients recovering from anesthesia (Phillips, Street, Kent, Haesler, &

• Include the patient, family members, and any home care aides in the development of an individualized home safety plan • Consider the patient's cognition and other fall risk factors when planning care • Educate the patient and/or family members regarding a plan of care to prevent a fall in the home

these scores takes into account various patient, ED, and hos-pital information, and yields a numerical value that indicates whether an ED is running smoothly, is crowded but effective, or is overcrowded at a given point in time Since each crowding score takes in specific hospital and patient characteristics and is judged against its own corre-

nurses, takes almost as long as the NIHSS, and requires the user to calculate a score The 3I-SS,9 CPSS,10 LAMS,13 and RACE17 scores require the user to remember the test items; the name does not trigger testing or next steps Using LAMS13 or a single deficit screen such as severe hemiparesis18 is a more simple approach but has somewhat limited

Step 2 Divide sum by number of activities actually rated This is the average DLA score Step 3 To estimate GAF or mGAF , multiply the average DLA by 10 Compare to DSMIV Axis V GAF description on back and compare to calculated DLA+3 points Step 4 +/- Change/Outcome Score: subtract GAF/mGAF, column R1 from most recent rating R2 to R5
